

Help these Regina workers fight American-style union busting

Their goals are modest and reasonable. They are willing to negotiate. But Lehigh Cement locked out these three employees who operate their Regina cement distribution facility in mid-January.

On at least two occasions, the employees thought they had an agreement, only for the company to come back with new demands — a tactic which is common in the United States, but not in Saskatchewan.

The employees' union has filed a charge of unfair labour practices with the Saskatchewan Labour Relations Board. But after constantly demanding immediate meetings, the company says it now can't meet at a hearing until June.

What you can do

Call your MLA and tell him or her that we don't need American-style confrontation in our labour relations.

Attend a solidarity picket on Thursday, April 24 at 10:00 am at Lehigh Cement on Fleet Street North (past the Upgrader, north of the landfill), Regina.
